

YEPA Side-Event: Youth Entrepreneurship Summit in Austria on **13-14 November 2024** is a two-day youth entrepreneurship summit hosted by the **Platform for Entrepreneurship of the Austrian Federal Ministry of Labour & Economy** and the **Austrian Federal Ministry of Education, Science and Research** in Vienna. The summit aims to raise awareness of the challenges faced by young people interested in entrepreneurship, particularly in their gain the needed entrepreneurship knowledge and skills to transition into the labour market through entrepreneurship. RECAP OF WORKSHOP 4

In September, YEPA came together for the fourth workshop with each country group selecting their own topic. Group 1 focused on the importance of building networks for young entrepreneurs, while Group 2 discussed how role models can inspire young people to pursue entrepreneurship as a career. Lastly, Group 3 explored how AI and rapid technology innovations are shaping a new era of youth entrepreneurship. Summary Note Recording

Inspiring young entrepreneurs with role models | 11 September 2024

Workshop for Group 2 was hosted by **JA Estonia – Kersti Loor** (Estonia) and explored how role models can be effectively used to inspire young entrepreneurs. The workshop featured presentations by the OECD and **Professor Ulla Hytti** (University of Turku, Finland) that underlined the importance of role models for building entrepreneurial motivations and intentions among young people. The workshop also included an interview with young entrepreneur **Jascha Mähler** (WILDPLASTICS, Germany) as well as a panel discussion featuring **Maria Palk** (JA Alumni Estonia, Estonia), **Lucie Kempff** (SheEOs, France), **Aina Špaca** (Future Heroes, Latvia) and **George Krachtopoulos** (Greece). The group discussions focused on how to identify and leverage entrepreneurial role models for young people, particularly those interested in entrepreneurship, and were supported by lead discussants **Kersti Loor** and **Carin Holmquist** (Sweden).

New era of youth entrepreneurship: AI and rapid technology innovations | 12 September 2024

Workshop for Group 3 was hosted by **Cyprus – Hess Adnani**. The workshop discussed the impact of AI and rapid technology innovations on entrepreneurship, particularly youth entrepreneurs. The workshop featured presentations by the OECD and **Hess Adnani** (Unity Growth & Start-Up Grind Cyprus, Cyprus) that highlighted key issues to consider as AI and other technologies become more prevalent, leading to a new era of digital and AI-driven entrepreneurship. The workshop also included a panel discussion featuring young AI entrepreneurs: **Filip Wauters** (Outro AI and Jay, Belgium), **Elliot Evertsson Norrevik** (Roster AI, Sweden) and **Joana Pinto** (Clynx Health, Portugal) who shared their experiences starting and scaling AI-based start-ups. **Emma Kiraly** (JA Europe) and **Raquel Santos** (Build Up Labs, Portugal) also presented case studies of entrepreneurship support programmes that are currently addressing AI skills gaps and helping entrepreneurs to implement AI innovations into their businesses.

Building networks for young entrepreneurs | 19 September 2024

Workshop for Group 1 was hosted by Youth Business International - Anita **Tiessen**. The workshop discussed how effective networks can be built for young entrepreneurs as well as how existing entrepreneurial networks can become more inclusive and accessible to young entrepreneurs. The workshop featured a presentation by the OECD on the role of entrepreneurial networks on the development and growth of youth entrepreneurs and a case study presentation on how Youth Business International leverages their network to support young entrepreneurs by **Victoria Edwards** (Youth Business International). The workshop also included an interview with **Eva Claas** who is a lader in the Young Founders Network (Germany) as well as a panel discussion featuring Franziska Metzbaur (Jugend Gründet, Germany), Sara Simon Penas (Youth Business Spain, Spain) and Simone Schirru (RREUSE, Belgium). The group discussions explored different networking opportunities (e.g. integrated into existing support schemes, youth-dedicated entrepreneurship networks, mainstream entrepreneurship and professional networks) and how to bolster inclusion and accessibility of young people. Lead discussants Ruben Brave (the Netherlands) and **Kerstin Heuer** (Germany) supported the discussions in the breakout groups.

COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT

- **Ewald Kibler** and his research team received the Entrepreneurship Research of the Year award from the Boardman Business Management Research Group for a study that investigates the need for againclusive entrepreneurial environments, particularly for late-career entrepreneurship.
- Youth Business International hosted their Global Youth Entrepreneurship Summit in Nairobi, Kenya, from 8-10 October. The Summit gathered YBI members and youth entrepreneurship experts from over 50 countries with the aim to shape the future of youth entrepreneurship, focusing on responsible entrepreneurship, innovative youth-led businesses and diverse entrepreneurship support for young entrepreneurs.
- YEPA participants from Sweden have created the Entrepreneurship Working Group, which hosted
 a webinar on 18 September. The webinar focused on fostering entrepreneurship, addressing skills
 gaps and supporting lifelong learning.
- YEPA participants were involved in the hosting of the Mediterranean Youth Building Inclusive Entrepreneurial Ecosystems Forum was held on 16-18 September in Helsinki, Finland, with many other YEPA participants in attendance. The Forum was co-organsied by the European Commission on behalf of the Union for the Mediterranean Co-Presidency with the Union for the Mediterranean Secretariat and MIMIR. It has also been prepared in close co-operation with Aaltoes, the European Training Foundation, the Mediterranean Network of New Chance, the Young Professionals Network and the Anna Lindh Foundation.
- On 10 September, the first YEPA side-event was held in collaboration with the Ministry of Labour,
 Pension System, Family and Social Policy and the Croatian Bank for Reconstruction and
 Development. Many thanks for the YEPA participants who attended the event, particularly YEPA participants Slavica Singer, Ahmed Hadi and Regina Bajc who presented case studies.
