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Why are entrepreneurship networks important?

Entrepreneurship networks play a significant role in motivating young people to pursue entrepreneurship and help them to identify opportunities, validate ideas and access resources such as customers, business partners, suppliers and advisors

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Why is network creation for young entrepreneurs a priority policy issue?

- Greater need for entrepreneurship networks than older entrepreneurs
- > Less connected to the business community
- ➤ Less developed professional networks and often have little to "give back"
- Lack of assets relevant to entrepreneurship (e.g. financial, human and social capital)












Two-thirds of EU Member States have introduced youth-dedicated networking initiatives


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Young people report networks are an impactful support
